

Tissues will be made available throughout the workplace. the following measures will be followed- Tight-fitting respirators (such as disposable FFP3 masks and reusable half masks) rely on having a good seal with the wearer's face. A face fit test will be carried out to ensure the respiratory protective equipment (RPE) can protect the wearer. Wearers must be clean shaven.	Test face pieces that cannot be adequately disinfected (e.g. disposable half masks) should not be used by more than one individual. Symptoms of Covid-19 If anyone becomes unwell with a new continuous cough or a high temperature in the workplace they will be sent home and advised to follow the stay at home guidance. Line managers will maintain regular contact with staff members during this time.	Internal communication channels and cascading of messages through line managers will be carried out regularly to reassure and support employees in a fast changing situation.
